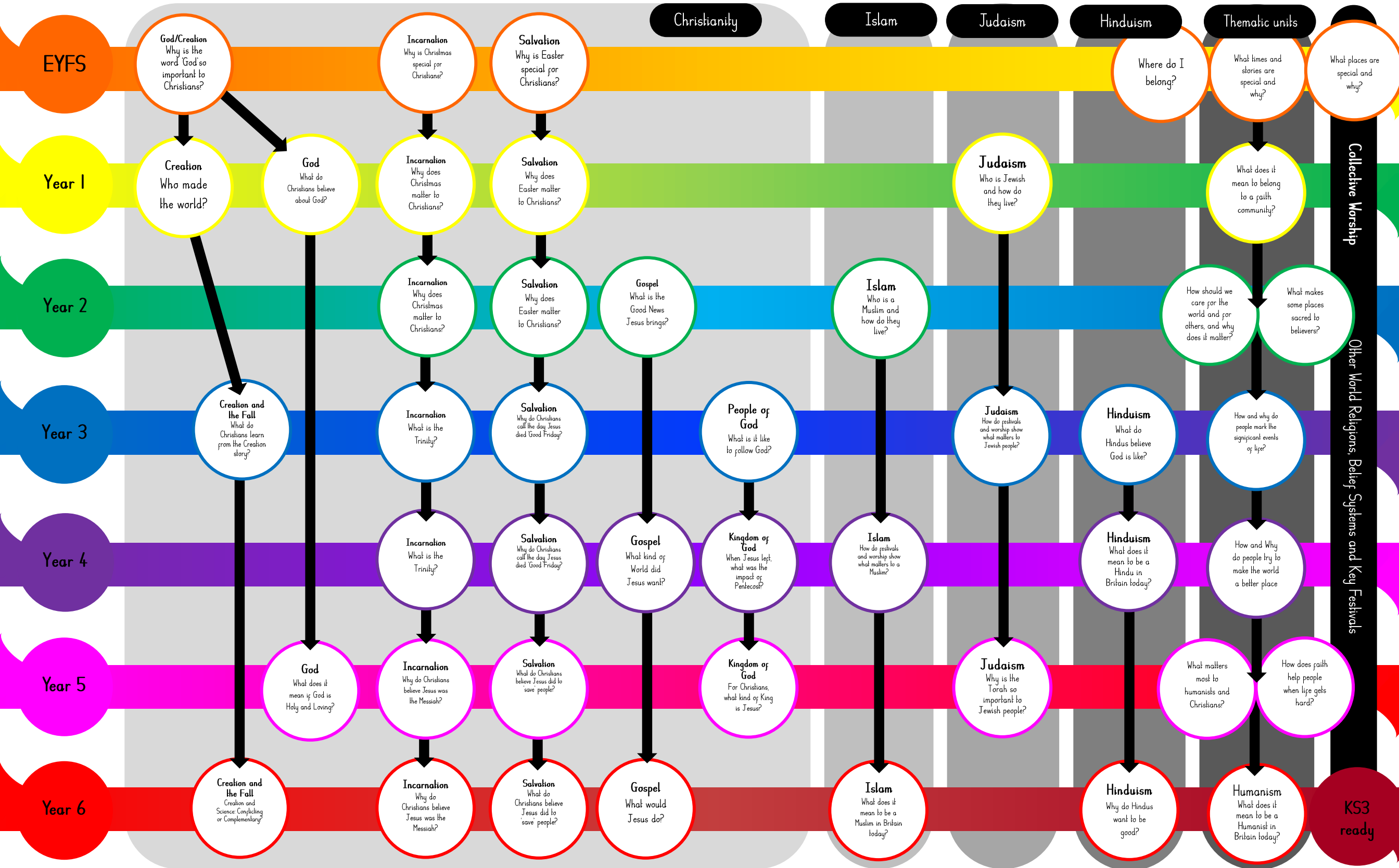




RE Curriculum Road Map 2026-2027

In EYFS RE is embedded throughout the year using real life experience of artefacts and festivals, particularly at significant times of the year. Children describe similarities and differences between religious and cultural communities. Christianity is taught using the 'Understanding Christianity' resource with a different focus each term. Additional units are taught throughout the year, linked to the seasons and with a focus on thematic units at the end of the year. In KS1, children are taught RE in weekly lessons throughout the year. The children begin to expand on the concepts introduced for Christianity in EYFS and begin to study Islam and Judaism in further detail. In Lower KS2, the children continue to expand the concepts they are introduced to for Christianity units and continue to revisit key concepts from the previous key stage. Children continue to develop their depth of understanding of both Islam and Judaism. Hinduism is introduced formally for the first time although children will have come across the religions through work on festival such as Diwali.

In Upper KS2, the children continue to expand the concepts they are introduced to for Christianity units and continue to revisit key concepts from the previous key stage. Children continue to develop their depth of understanding of both Islam, Judaism and Hinduism. Non-religious worldviews such as Humanism are explored in greater depth. Additional hours of time are provided during the Autumn Term through end-of-term focus days to allow for seasonal 'Incarnation' units to be taught in all year groups before Christmas and then again for 'Salvation' units at Easter. This allows for the units to be taught in greater depth over a two-year cycle and revisited yearly. Units of work are planned for children in 'The Hive' as SEND provision for children receiving alternative provision. Children from 'The Hive' also spend some time in their base class where RE may be taught. The SEND programme evolves each year to meet the specific needs of the children in 'The Hive'.
