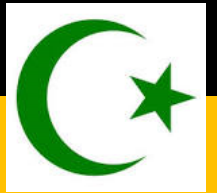

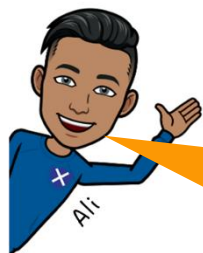

<b>ibadah</b>	Worship and belief in action

<b>Wudu</b>	A special pattern of washing the hands, face, head, arms and feet before prayer.
<b>Salat</b>	Obligatory Muslim prayers performed five times per day
<b>Ramadan</b>	Ramadan is a month in the Muslim calendar. Every year, in this month, Muslims fast and go without food or drink in their daily life in the hours of daylight.
<b>Zakat</b>	When Muslims commit to be generous in helping poorer people
<b>Sawm</b>	Fasting

## Key Questions and Golden Nuggets

What are the key beliefs of Muslims?	Christianity and Islam are both monotheistic religions which means both Christians and Muslims believe in just one god. Muslims have 99 different names for Allah which show his nature. Muslims believe that Muhammad (peace be upon him) was Allah's special messenger who received the word of Allah on the Night of Power. <b>Ibadah means worship and belief in action.</b>
What do we already know about Muslims and Islam?	'Islam' means having peace because of being in harmony with God. A Muslim is someone who willingly submits to God. This means following Allah's guidance willingly because Muslims believe.
What does the opening chapter of the Qur'an teach Muslims about God?	<b>Muslims use the Qur'an as the guide to how they must live their lives.</b> There are rules which tell people how to be good. Here are some of them: 1. Do not serve any other gods but the Lord 2. Be good to your parents and respect them 3. Do not kill anyone 4. Do not be wasteful or mean because all of your possessions belong to God 5. Do not steal and do not cheat 6. Always keep your promises
Why does prayer matter to Muslims?	<b>Many Muslims will pray 5 times a day</b> at these particular times. Not all Muslims pray five times a day. Some may do it once, or some days not at all. <b>Many will perform du'a (personal prayer) at any time of day.</b>
Why is the mosque a special place for Muslims?	Mosque is a place that helps Muslims worshippers to <b>show respect for Allah</b> and a place where Muslims are helped to <b>express and develop their beliefs.</b>
Why do Muslims celebrate the end of Ramadan?	Fasting during the month of Ramadan is an important part of God's rules in the Qur'an. The very young, the old and the ill do not fast because of their health. <b>Fasting helps Muslims to have sympathy with poor people who may be hungry not by choice and it also encourages Muslims to not be greedy.</b>

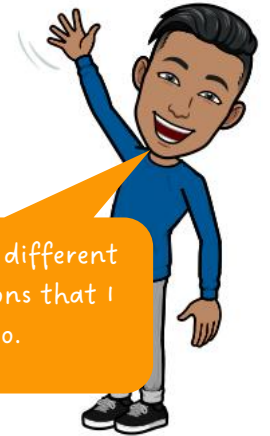
Ramadan starts when the new Moon first appears in the night sky. Full moon marks the middle of Ramadan. As the moon wanes to the other side, Ramadan finishes.

Birmingham Central Mosque



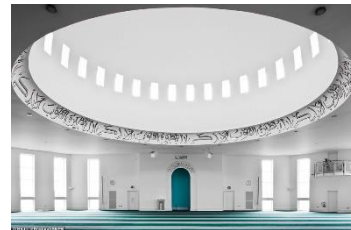
Didsbury Mosque – A converted Methodist Chapel



Shahporan Masjid and Islamic Centre Trust – A converted lock-making factory



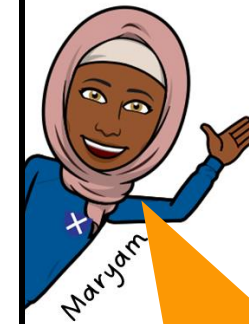
Faizan E Madina Mosque in Millfield – One of the largest mosques in Western Europe with capacity to accommodate around 3000 worshippers across three floors.
