


Christianity	A religion. People who follow this religion are called Christians.

Key Questions and Golden Nuggets

<p>Who do Christian and Jews believe made the world? Christians believe that God made the world in 6 days and then rested on the 7th day. The story of Creation shows that God is a creator and is creative.</p>	<p>How do Christians and Jews take care of Creation? Christians and Jews both believe that God cares about his creation and wants the people he created to care for it too. Some Christians and Jews choose to be environmentally friendly.</p>
<p>What happens in the Christian and Jewish story of Creation and what does this tell us about the natural world? Christians and Jews both share the same Creation story from Genesis 1. Christians and Jews both believe that when God created the world and all of the creatures, he said it was 'good'.</p>	<p>What do Christian, Jewish and non-religious people believe about caring for people? Christians and Jews both believe that God made humans 'in his image' and when he had made them he said they were 'very good'. This means we should care for people as a special part of God's creation. Non-religious people often also believe that people should be cared for but for different reasons such as the Golden Rule.</p>
<p>What stories do Christians and Jewish people tell about the beginning of the world and how to treat the world? Christians and Jews both believe that God made the world in 6 days and rested on the 7th day. Christians and Jews both believe that it is important to work hard and to care for creation but that rest is important to.</p>	<p>How should we treat each other and the natural world? Why? Christians, Jews and many non-religious people believe it is important to care for each other and for the natural world but for different reasons. I believe.....</p>
