Heritage School Champion

Here at Netherton CofE we are extremely proud of our Heritage Project which combines History & Geography skills to learn about the local area.

Mrs Powell & Mrs Ryall-White worked with Historic England to write our bespoke Heritage project, they have since gone on to talk to & inspire other schools to do something similar.

They have continued to work with Historic England and continued to develop our teaching and learning about the local area, for example most recently working with a local photographer to 'see the local area differently'.

We are very proud to announce that all of this hard work and good practice has been recognised by Historic England who have chosen us as a **Championship Heritage School**. We are 1 of just 17 schools nationally, to be given this award,

Martin Philips from Historic England came into school to present us with our award on Remembrance Day where Year 6 led a whole school assembly on this theme

The children have been incredibly busy this month, here is a taste of what's been going on...

Reception - Understanding the World

Reception went to Saltwells Woods. They spent lots of time exploring and finding out fun facts all about Autumn.







Year 1 - Science

Year 1 had a lovely day exploring Saltwells Woods identifying the changes that happen around us in the Season Autumn.

Emma (the Warden), was full of lots of knowledge which she shared with us. We llearn lots of new things each time we go on our Seasonal walks.

Luckily, when the rain came we were inside the Saltwells classroom which meant we did not get too wet!

Year 2 - Geography

Our little meteorologists created forecasts for Edinburgh, London, Belfast, and Cardiff, then stepped into the spotlight as weather reporters!

The classroom transformed as they delivered their predictions with such enthusiasm and flair!







Year 3 - Science

In one of their science lessons, the children in Year 3 investigated how transparent, translucent or opaque some materials are.

They looked at felt, card, foil and paper!

Year 4 - Fire Safety

Y4 were fortunate enough to have four members of the West Midlands Fire Service visit to teach us all about fire safety.

Y4 should now know the answers to the following questions

- What three things are required for a fire to start?
- What happens, eventually, if you remove one of those three things?
- Where should a smoke alarm be installed?
- What should you do immediately if your smoke alarm sounds?
- What hazards can there be in a home that may cause a fire?
- What three things should you do if you are on fire?







Year 5 - Forest School



In Science, Y6 have been exploring light, how it travels from a source, reflects off an object and into our eyes so that we can see. Year 6 were amazing with their experiments and enjoyed explaining how the light travels. They explored how the angles of the light change dependent on the level at which the object is and the location of the light source.

The Impact of News on Children - Internet Matters

The world is one of cycles. The current generation moving through the school system, are doing so in a time of particular instability. The consequence for the media landscape has been a shift from 'light' news to a constant stream of 'heavy' content. Online this trend has been inescapable whether to drive clicks or generate controversy, increasingly our media consumption has been overtaken by gloom.

This pessimistic outlook has been further enhanced by the continuing evolution of AI. News stories that would have once been unquestioned, now straddle the line of real and fake. For children and young people whose critical faculties are not yet fully developed, this can provoke a whirlwind of confusion. Confusion tends to breed negative mental health effects since one can no longer distinguish true from false.

Ages 6-10

- Watch or read news together (e.g., Newsround).
- Use Stop-Show-Share: Stop scrolling, show an adult, share feelings.
- Keep explanations simple and reassuring.
- Use fun examples (e.g. "Would you believe it if you saw a dog driving a car?").
- Ask: "What do you think this story means?
 How can we check if it's true?"

Ages 11-13

- Explain <u>algorithms:</u> "Your feed is shaped by what you've liked, not what's most true."
- Practise before-you-share rules.
- Talk to children about what reliable sources are and what they look like. Encourage them to follow these sources. Ask: "If this came from an influencer, where did they get it from?"

Online Safety

Keeping our children safe in a world of technology continues to be a priority.
